COURSE DESCRIPTION

A study of the legal and social environment in which businesses operate, including structure and operation of legal institutions, development of common law and legislation, ethics, social responsibility and evolvement of cultural norms, government regulation of business, contracts, and the international legal environment.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

The objective is to provide the students with basic understanding of societal and legal structures in which businesses operate and the mechanisms by which businesses participate in developing cultural and legal norms in a society. The course emphasizes on ethical, environmental and social responsibilities of businesses in the global environment.
